

Criteria for Enrolment at Pukekohe High School

International students at Pukekohe High School must:

- Have an English speaking parental representative who has been designated by, and to act on behalf of the student's parents while the student is studying at the School. The parents representative must be readily accessible at any time, to help the student or school should the need arise. This person will meet with the Director of International Students at least twice a year. Pukekohe High school can organise this for you.
- Live in one of the following types of accommodation:
 - homestay accommodation chosen and monitored by the school.
 - with their parents or legal guardian (proof of **legal** guardianship must be supplied).
 - with designated caregiver chosen by the parents – declaration forms **must** be completed by the parents and the designated caregiver. The Designated caregiver should be a relation of the student or **close** family friend.
 - All travel away from the approved accommodation is authorised in advance by the Director or Senior Management Team.
- Prove that they have medical and personal loss insurance for the entire time that they are studying at Pukekohe High School.
- Inform Pukekohe High School of any serious sickness, behavioural problems, disability, mental illness or specific learning needs at the time of application.
- Have a basic knowledge of the English language, basic letter recognition skills and numeracy.
- Include a copy of their latest school report and examination results with their application to Pukekohe High School.
- Have their parents' consent to study at Pukekohe High School.
- Meet the conditions of New Zealand Immigration Service student's visa/permit requirements.
- Accept the direction of the Director of International Students and/or Dean of Houses and Heads of Departments in subject and year level placements.
